Federation Update Events Affecting Kings Point

Irrigation Restrictions

Once again SWFMD (Southwest Florida Water Management District) is implementing water restrictions for Hillsborough County from March 13 thru July 3, 2013. That means, in Kings Point, lawn watering will be reduced to one time per week. ValleyCrest will implement this new schedule as required by the law and in accordance with the configuration of our irrigation systems in the community. New lawns (sod) and plants have special irrigation rules that ValleyCrest will adhere to for these new plantings to get established. In addition, hand watering by residents is limited to before 8 A. M. and after 6 P. M. daily. Let's all be good stewards of our limited water resources.

Landscape Contract

In the Federation Membership Meeting in February, the Membership voted to retain Valley-Crest as the landscaper for the Kings Point community. The Federation is in the process of negotiating the contract for the next three years. Forms have been sent to each Association for Unit Owners to identify their existing owner-maintained beds to get ready for the new 360° landscape maintenance adopted in the new contract.

Golf Cart Path

The remedial storm-water construction has been completed at the corner of Trinity Lakes and SR 674. FDOT replaced the collapsed storm-water pipes. Remaining, however, is a large pool of water in the ditch adjacent to the area that was repaired. This is due to drainage-ditch obstruction and not due to any faulty pipes. A contract is being prepared to have the ditches on north and south SR674 dredged, between U S 301 and I 75. No timeline has been given.

2020 Building Renovation

Prudential has moved from the 2020 Clubhouse Drive building to their new location in Sun City Center. Plans for the future renovation of the building for use by the residents of Kings Point are under development. Concepts will be presented to the community in the near future.

- The mounds of dirt along Kings Blvd. are for the construction of a berm—plants will be added to enhance the appearance of the area along the main street of our community.
- The vehicles behind the tennis court are temporarily stored there while the fence along the RV lot is built.

Security & Safety

ust when you think it is safe to go back in the water, they throw something new at you." That was what I was thinking when everything electronic turned against my procedures for getting your visitors to your door in a safe and efficient manner. Every time we thought we had solved the problem, another one was thrown at us to overcome to include a complete phone outage at the South gate over the holidays. The good part about all of this is it gave me a chance to look at my procedures to make sure I had a backup plan in case some of the technological luxuries we have gotten used to turn against us. This also got me to think about how we would operate in case we lost power and phones with the upcoming storm season quickly approaching. After all is said and done, I just wanted to take the time and go over the procedures for getting a visitor to your residence and quell any rumors the problems we had to solve might have caused.

The front gate (813-634-2063) is open 24/7 and will take visitor requests up to seven days in advance. The south gate (813-645-9355) is open every day from 6 AM to 10 PM. You can call the request in to either gate and we will make sure your visitor gets in if they show up at either one. If you know for sure which gate your visitor is going to arrive, it is best to call that gate with the information; however, it is not a requirement. As a suggestion, most local stores use the south gate for deliveries and if your guest is going to use a GPS to find your house, most MapQuest programs take them to the Southgate. That being said, if your guest shows up at a gate and is not on the list we have there, the Officer will contact the other gate to see if it is with their paperwork. If the other gate has the visit request, he tells the other gate Officer and we just issue the pass and complete the paperwork at the gate your visitor is at and send them on their way. This sometimes takes some extra time if the computer is down or the other gate is on the phone; however, we have recently installed two way radios to talk between the gates for situations like

that.

If for some reason we have misplaced the visit request or you forgot to call, we will call or ask your visitor to call and ask for you to verify the visit. We ask that you call us if this happens because we cannot use your visitor's cell phone. Too many times in the past the cell phone has been dropped in the exchange between users and then they want us to pay for the broken phone. Once we have verified that you indeed want this visitor to come onto Kings Point, we will issue them a pass and get them on their way. You can authorize a visitor a pass for anywhere from one to 30 days. We ask that you limit the pass to what they really need so we keep better control on who enters Kings Point. You can also make the visitor request at kpsccvisitor@vestaforyou.com as long as you give us 24 hours advance notice. We will also send you a confirmation to make sure we have everything. If you do not get a confirmation, please follow up with us to make sure something did not happen. I think we finally have this process back under control and I want to thank you for being so patient with us lately. I hope this article clears up any misconceptions out there.







Healthy Hints: April 2013

National Distracted Driver Awareness Month

Safe driving requires mentally focusing exclusively on driving alone. When driving and talking on the phone, the driver's attention is diverted and he/she see only up to 50% of the driving environment. The brain is overloaded and suffers from

inattention blindness. It's important not to talk on a cell phone while driving—to keep yourself \underline{AND} others safe.

Inattention Blindness:

- A cognitive distraction (looking but not seeing).
- While talking on phones, drivers are less likely to see exits, red lights, stop signs visual cues, high and low relevant objects, and navigational signage.

Multitasking: A Brain Drain:

- Multitasking for the brain is a myth. Human brains cannot perform two tasks at the same time.
- The brain must handle tasks sequentially and must juggle tasks and attention.
- The brain switches between primary and secondary tasks driving and using the cell phone. Different regions of the brain must pull from a shared and limited resource for unrelated tasks.
- The brain filters information due to overload and drivers are not aware of the information filtered out.
- Drivers miss critical information on potential hazards and the information does not get into memory.

Distracted Driving Kills

- Motor vehicle crashes are the #1 cause of death for 3 to 34 year olds.
- In 2008, 28% of all fatal crashes were attributable to cell phones use.
- In 2011, 3,331 people were killed and 387,000 people were injured because of distracted drivers.
- At any moment during daylight hours, 800,000 vehicles are being driven by someone using a hand-held cell phone.
- At any one time, 9% of drivers are talking on cell phones and cell phone users are 4x as likely to crash. Headset cell phone use is not substantially safer.
- Sending or receiving a text takes a driver's eyes from the road for an average of 4.6 seconds; at 55 mph, that is like driving the length of a football field blind.

Please share these facts with others to help save lives. Turn off your cell phone when you turn your ignition on!

The Power of Good Posture

Standing or sitting up straight will cause you to look thinner and taller in an instant! Your posture not only effects how you look, but also how you feel! There are also many inward benefits of good posture.

Some important benefits of good posture:

- 1. Better ability to breathe-more room for chest expansion during inhalation.
- 2. Less stress on the joints and muscles yielding less pain and an optimal range of motion. A reduced chance of developing arthritis.
- 3. Better circulation—A healthy posture allows the blood to carry oxygen and nutrients to all parts of the body and also to remove metabolic wastes.
- 4. Reduced fatigue-Tendons and ligaments don't have to work so hard and less effort is used in performing your daily tasks.
- 5. Walking tall conveys self-confidence and grace; a feeling of strength.
- 6. Better digestion-Our digestive organs need room to perform their important functions.
- 7. Fewer aches and pains-Good posture allows your spine to be as aligned and balanced as possible reducing headaches, neck pain, back pain, tendonitis, and imbalanced muscles.
- 8. Feeling more energized-Slouching actually forces your body to work harder than sitting tall, creating more fatigue. Proper posture uses our bodies energy most efficiently and we are less apt to feel tired.
- 9. You use your "deep core" muscles. Good posture creates stronger abdominal muscles. Standing and sitting in correct posture engages these muscles that help support your lower back.
- 10. You'll look better! Align your body in correct posture and check yourself out in the mirror. You really will have a smaller waist and will be a little taller!

Achieving good posture:

- During the day, stand or sit tall as though there were a string attached to the top of your head that is being pulled up.
- · Keep your cheekbones in a vertical line with your collarbone.
- Avoid slouching by imagining a flashlight in your breastbone that always shines forward, not down on your lap or on the floor.
- Avoid sitting for long periods of time. Stand and stretch as much as possible.
- When standing, balance your weight on both legs equally.
- Exercise regularly– Walking and swimming strengthen weak muscles and stretch those that are tight.

Pay attention to your posture-Enjoy looking great and feeling great!
