

Important Alert for all Golf Cart Users...

We have been advised that the golf cart path to WalMart will be closed to all traffic from January 14 through January 18 for resurfacing, repairs and improvements to the drainage system. These repairs should significantly improve the condition of the cart path. However, during this time the cart path will be blockaded against all traffic. <u>Please do not use the path for your own safety until traffic is restored.</u> BE SAFE!

Reality Check....

Kings Point Heritage Park

Questions have been asked about landscaping for the Heritage Park. YES—the COA has plans under development for landscaping the park. It is a work in progress and will improve over time.

<u>RV Storage Lot</u> What's going on? A wall is replacing the trees that were removed on Kings Blvd.

Bright House Channels

A question has been asked about whether Bright House can change the selection of channels they offer on their service, change them from analog to digital, or modify what they offer in their standard package under the contract between Kings Point and Bright House. The answer is YES—Bright House can change the standard channel line-up at its sole discretion. They can also move channels from analog to digital and modify their programming. Bright House offers the same channels to Kings Point as they offer to residential customers in Hillsborough County.

Dumpster Use

The Federation has a contract with WSI to provide dumpsters within several Associations. These Associations pay for this service for the sole use of their residents. These dumpsters are not for use by anyone who does not live in those Associations. These dumpsters are also not to be used by contractors to fill them with debris from a single residence so that others in an Association cannot dispose of their trash properly. If you do not live in an Association that uses dumpsters, please be courteous and do not use them—they are not for you.

The Loft Lounge...

In February the new Loft Lounge will open. This lounge expands the seating at the South Club café by about 60 additional seats and provides additional options for residents for food and socializing, including continental breakfast options and evening cocktails. Security briefing

o everyone that survived the end of the world that was predicted for December 21, 2012, Happy New Year. I guess this means I will have to start thinking about paying some of those bills I ran up in anticipation of not having to repay them. I would like to use this article to give you an update on what I am trying to accomplish in this upcoming year. I have about nine months on the job now and have identified some things that I will be trying to improve on.

South Entrance Gate Operations. I have received a number of suggestions on how to improve the way things are done at the South Gate. The amount of traffic continues to grow each day and it is no longer just a delivery or construction gate. Part of the challenge is the amount of space and the layout of the entrance itself. The other challenge is the mindset that it is just a delivery gate, without traffic to justify increased manning levels. This month I will be instituting a cross training program to bring some of my other supervisors and officers to the South Gate to have a fresh set of eyes to look at how we do business and to institute some improvements. You will start to see some minor changes at night to restrict the number of entrance lanes. This might mean a slight delay as we process a visitor; but will be well worth the increase in safety. The other improvement you will see in the near future is the installation of a closed circuit camera system at both gates to improve our security measures and to provide historical data of events. I have been in the process of rewriting our internal procedures on how to increase safety here and the camera system will help verify that the new procedures are working. Please bear with us.

Visitor Entry Procedures: My goal is to insure that every guest that has been properly invited onto Kings Point property get to their intended destination as quickly and safely as possible. We get it right 98% of the time. You can help us out the most by informing your guest of what we are looking for at the gate. Our



entry system is driven by the assumption that your guest will know your address. I can find your address by looking up your name; however, that takes time. You can really help us out by making sure that your guests know your address and unit number. The unit number is especially important when we get into the Andover, Bedford and Cambridge areas to name a few. The other thing you can do is to call in advance, up to a week before the visit. You can also email us the visit request as long as you give us 24 hours' notice. Monday morning deliveries are the busiest. You can really help us out by letting us know about your purchase as soon as you get home from the store with the delivery information. Just send the request to kpsccvisitor@vestaforyou.com. Please include your name, address you want the visitor to go to including the unit number, phone number, name of the visitor and the number of days they will be visiting. We will send you a confirmation email or request additional information. I will close by saying that I truly appreciate the opportunity you have extended my officers and I to provide you with the safest location in Hillsborough County as we continue to explore ways to increase your security levels without compromising your quality of life this year.





Healthy Hints: February 2013

American Heart Month

Every 36 seconds, someone dies from heart and blood vessel diseases-America's #1 killer. Most of those deaths are from coronary heart disease– about 452,000 each year!

Warning signs of a heart attack:

- Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain in the center of your chest that lasts more than a few minutes or goes away and comes back.
- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, your back, neck, jaw, or stomach.
- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort.
- Nausea, breaking out in a cold sweat, or lightheadedness.

Why don't people act fast enough?

Half of all people having a heart attack wait more than 2 hours before getting help.

- Some people feel it would be embarrasing to have a "false alarm."
- Some people are so afraid they are having a heart attack that they convence themselves they aren't having one. These feelings are very dangerous.

If you or someone you are with has chest discomfort, especially with one or more of the other signs, don't wait more than 5 minutes before calling for help. Call 9-1-1 or the emergency medical services in your area (fire department or ambulance). Get medical care immediately!

What changes should I make to improve my heart health?

- Get help to quit if you smoke.
- Control high blood pressure.
- Keep your cholesterol in a safe range.
- Control your blood sugar.
- Be physically active.
- Eat healthy meals low in saturated fat, trans fat, cholesterol and salt.
- Get involved in regular physical activities.
- Lose weight if you need to.
- Have regular medical check-ups.
- Take your medicine exactly as prescribed.

If you or someone close to you shows signs of a heart attack, call 9-1-1 and get help right away. Knowledge is power, so Learn and Live! For more information visit heart.org/answersbyheart.

Fiber - How Important Is It?

Studies show that those with the highest intake of fiber have a significantly lower risk of dying of any cause.

<u>What is fiber?</u> A plant-derived carbohydrate that cannot be digested by humans, so it passes through your system relatively intact and has little to no caloric value.

There are two types of fiber. Soluble (dissolves in water) and insoluble (does not dissolve in water). Both types are important to your health and are found, often together, in foods such as whole grains, fruits, vegetables, nuts, seeds, and beans.

Fiber in your diet helps you by:

- Working as a natural laxative because it increases stool bulk allowing the stool to pass more readily through the colon.
- Possibly playing a role in the management of those with irritable bowel syndrome and those with loose stools.
- Acting as prebiotics feeding healthy bacteria in your gut, leading to better colon health.
- Improving blood sugar by slowing down the rate that food empties from your stomach, delaying the rise in blood sugar after meals and preventing an excess insulin release.
- Improving hunger control due to delayed stomach emptying.
- Adding bulk to your diet without adding calories, an aid to long-term weight loss.

How much fiber do you need? Women should consume about 25 grams of fiber per day and men should consume 38 grams. Most Americans get less than half the daily recommended amount of fiber.

<u>What foods are good sources of fiber?</u> Fruits, vegetables, whole grains, nuts, seeds, and beans contain naturally occurring fiber which is the best for health benefits. Choose whole foods for optimal health and avoid refined and highly processed grains and fruit juices that have been stripped of their fiber, and many nutrients.

You might need a fiber supplement if:

- You have trouble taking in adequate amounts of fiber each day.
- Suffer from bowel problems and high cholesterol.

If you increase your fiber intake, remember to do so slowly to avoid gas and bloating. Also, be sure to drink plenty of water. To find the fiber content of popular foods visit: http://www.nationalfibercouncil.org/food_chart.shtml.
